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Introduction

Erasmus+ Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP) offer an internationalization experience combining a short physical mobility abroad to a mandatory virtual component.

ART. 1 – AIMS AND FEATURES OF THE CALL

This call aims at selecting a maximum of 10 students of the University of Turin to attend an Erasmus+ BIP mobility, divided as follows:

- At least 3 seats for the Department of Molecular Biotechnology and Health Sciences;
- At least 3 seats for the Department of Drug Science and Technology;
- At least 3 seats for the Department of Life Sciences and Systems Biology;

Up to 26 students, not selected for the Erasmus+ BIP mobility, can carry out a virtual mobility, divided as follows:

- At least 8 seats for the Department of Molecular Biotechnology and Health Sciences;
- At least 8 seats for the Department of Drug Science and Technology;
- At least 8 seats for the Department of Life Sciences and Systems Biology;

UniTo students selected, together with students selected by the Partner University Paris-Saclay, will undertake an educational programme consisting of:

VIRTUAL MOBILITY:

online activities with professors and students of Universities involved in the BIP. This is a **mandatory activity** in the context of the BIP programme which does not provide for the allocation of any financial contribution. The start of the virtual mobility is scheduled for January 2025.

Only for blended mobility winners: SHORT PHYSICAL MOBILITY AT
Universidad CEU San Pablo Madrid from 7th to 11th July 2025.

For short mobilities abroad, **specific financial contributions** are provided to students based on the art. 4 of this Call.

At the end of the BIP, the Host University will award 3 ECTS, as specified in the BIP educational programme.

The recognition of credits will be made within the student's UniTo career based on what is agreed upon in the Learning Agreement.



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ART. 2 – PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

ART 2.1 – GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Before applying, it is necessary to check if a sufficient number of Erasmus mobility days are available to carry out the short physical mobility abroad.

The **total eligible duration per study cycle** for Erasmus mobilities, as detailed below:

- undergraduate degree programmes: maximum 12 months (360 days)
- postgraduate degree programmes: maximum 12 months (360 days)
- 5/6 years postgraduate degree programmes: maximum 24 months (720 days)
- PhD, specialisation courses or continuing education programmes (specializing masters): maximum 12 months (360 days)

It is also specified that:

- Any Erasmus+ virtual Mobility carried out in the student's usual country of residence starting from a.y. 2020/2021 will not be calculated in the total eligible duration per study cycle.
- It is possible to carry out one or more Erasmus mobilities in the same academic year but not contemporarily (Studies, Traineeship, BIP).
- The virtual mobility covered by this Call is compatible with other international mobility programs (including Erasmus).

ART 2.2 – PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED BY UNITO

All students regularly enrolled (including part-time students) in the following degree programmes can apply to this Erasmus+ BIP Call:

- 3° year L-13 *Scienze Biologiche* or 2° year LM-61 *Scienze degli Alimenti e della Nutrizione Umana*; in case of seat availability applicants enrolled to the 1st year of the LM-61 *Scienze degli Alimenti e della Nutrizione Umana* can be admitted to rankings;
- 4°/5° year LM-13 *Farmacia* or LM-13 *Chimica e Tecnologie Farmaceutiche*
- 3° year L-2 *Biotechnologie* and 2° year LM-9 *Molecular Biotechnology* and LM-8/LM-54 *Biotechnological and Chemical Sciences in Diagnostics*; in case of seat availability applicants enrolled to the 1st year of the LM-9 *Molecular Biotechnology* or LM-8/LM-54 *Biotechnological and Chemical Sciences in Diagnostics* can be admitted to rankings;

In order to participate, it is also necessary to:

- Be regularly enrolled at UNITO for the entire duration of the BIP period, until the completion of the physical mobility abroad, virtual mobility, and the procedure for the recognition of ECTS credits related to the BIP;



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- to have remaining academic activities in their study plan for a number of ECTS credits consistent with those required by the BIP, in order to recognize the activities completed at the end of the BIP mobility. With prior approval from their degree programme, it is possible to include in the study plan academic activities not aimed at obtaining the degree title (so-called “esami sovrannumerari”).

Candidates must have an adequate knowledge of the English language for the BIP.

ART. 3 – RECOGNISING THE EXPERIENCE

The academic activity carried out in the context of the BIP must be recognised within UniTo's academic curriculum. For this reason, the **recognition** of the activities carried out during the BIP mobility must be agreed upon with the [International Mobility Delegate of each Degree Programme](#) before the mobility, by filling out the “**Learning Agreement for Studies**”, in accordance with what is outlined in the academic regulations and study plans.

For the purposes of CFU recognition, it is necessary to:

- **IN THE APPLICATION PHASE** **verify the possibility of including in the career plan at UniTo** the academic activity for which the recognition will be requested, considering that it is possible to request the recognition of:
 - **Elective academic activities** or **Free credits** that do not assign a grade but can be recognised through the successful completion of the activity with an evaluation “IDONEO”.
 - Credits for **Blended Intensive Programme**, by stated in the Table B of the Learning Agreement in the field “*Component title at the Sending Institution*” the wording “*Blended Intensive Programme*” and by indicating the number of CFUs awarded by the chosen BIP.
- **AT THE END OF THE MOBILITY** submit the **documentation certifying the activity carried out** (final document “After the mobility” containing the learning outcomes and the dates of physical mobility period, certified by the Partner University).

Students who will carry out the activity in exclusively in VIRTUAL mode must agree with the [International Mobility Delegate of each Degree Programme](#) on the modalities of recognition for the training activity completed.

ART. 4 – ERASMUS BIP MOBILITY FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION

ART. 4.1 – STRUCTURE OF FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION AND FEWER OPPORTUNITIES DEFINITION



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Two types of financial contribution are provided to support the physical mobility period abroad within the framework of the Erasmus BIP:

1. **INDIVIDUAL SUPPORT** granted to all those who carry out physical mobility abroad. This contribution is determined by the duration of the physical mobility abroad;
2. **TRAVEL GRANT** for reaching and returning from the destination where the BIP takes place. This contribution varies based on the type of travel undertaken (standard or green transportation).

These contributions are intended for those who, after being successfully selected, **complete the physical and virtual mobility abroad** as part of the Erasmus BIP.

Fewer opportunities students will be able to receive additional supplementary contributions, in addition to individual support and travel contribution.

According to the present Call, students hold a “fewer opportunities” status if they have:

- $0 < \text{ISEE} < € 27.726,79$
- 50% level of disability (or higher);
- refugee status;
- subsidiary protection status;
- political refugee status;
- care-leaver status (art.1, comma 250, Law n. 205 of 2017);
- beneficiary of Italian Government study grant;
- children of parents with disability pensions, war orphans, visually impaired, wounded or invalids from war, work, or service and their children according to the amount defined in the Tax and Contribution Ruling a.y. 2024/2025.

The University of Turin will verify the actual fulfillment of one or more of the previous conditions through the data recorded in the student's academic career.

For the purposes of this Call, the ISEE and/or ISEE Equivalent or GDP per capita PPP value is based on data the University holds for the academic year 2024/2025 and on the Fees and Contributions Regulations for the academic year 2024/2025. See the [Fees and Contributions Regulations for the academic year 2024-25 - Annex A for GDP per capita PPP value](#). Should these documents not be in the possession of the University, no ISEE and/or Equivalent ISEE or GDP per capita PPP will be considered.



ART. 4.2 –STRUCTURE OF FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION FOR THE MOBILITY

Students who complete the mobility of this Erasmus BIP will receive cumulatively, based on the days of physical mobility abroad carried out within the BIP:



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1. Individual daily support

The amount of this contribution, granted on a daily basis, varies depending on the **number of days of physical mobility abroad** actually carried out and foreseen by the Erasmus BIP in which one participates. The daily amount is detailed in **Table 1**:

2. Travel grant

Specific contributions are provided to support the travel of students participating in the Erasmus BIP mobility. The different types of travel contributions, detailed in **Table 2**, are available **exclusively and are not cumulative with each other**, depending on the type (standard travel and green travel).

Students who opt for a **green travel** (carried out by bicycle, bus, train, or carsharing with other students) will receive an **additional daily contribution** for individual support (according to the amounts in **Table 1**) for **green travel, up to a maximum of six total days of travel, if necessary to reach the destination** (up to three days for the outbound journey and three for the return).



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The contribution for **green travel**:

- **will be awarded at the end of the Erasmus BIP mobility;**
- will be paid following the submission of **receipts for expenses incurred**, proving the actual **green** travel and the time required to reach the destination.

In the case of **mixed travel**, green and non-green, the contribution will only be granted if the green component of the journey exceeds the non-green component.

ART. 4.3 – SUPPLEMENTARY FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION FOR FEWER OPPORTUNITIES STUDENTS

Fewer opportunities students – as defined in art. 4.1 of this Call – receive the following supplementary amount:

SUPPLEMENTARY “TOP-UP” OF INDIVIDUAL SUPPORT

It is a one-time amount granted to support the Erasmus BIP mobility for fewer opportunities students (see the definition in Art. 4.1).

The amount of this one-time contribution varies depending on the number of **days of physical mobility abroad** actually carried out, as foreseen by the Erasmus BIP in which the student participates.

The amount is detailed in **Table 3**:

ART. 4.4 – PAYMENT MODALITIES AND TIMING

In the case of agreements for individual mobility signed at least 60 days before the start of physical mobility and in compliance with the deadlines that will be indicated:

- The University of Turin will grant, **before the start of physical mobility abroad**, the amount corresponding to **the individual support**, **the Travel Grant Standard**, and, **for fewer opportunities students, the TOP-UP contribution**;
- **At the end of the mobility**, based on the final documentation submitted by the student regarding the Erasmus BIP attended and any **green travel** undertaken to reach the destination, the balance due will be calculated, which may result in either a credit or a debit. The balance will take into account the advance received, considering the actual dates certified by the Partner University and any **green travel** undertaken.



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In the case where the mobility agreement is signed less than 60 days before the start of physical mobility, even if the delay is due to the imminent start of the BIP, the contribution cannot be guaranteed to be granted before the start of the mobility. The timing of the contribution payment will, however, be detailed within the mobility agreement signed with the winners of the Erasmus BIP.

Contributions received may be subject to full or partial repayment.

Full repayment of the granted contributions is required in the case of:

- withdrawal from the Erasmus BIP mobility period (physical and/or virtual) after the payment has been made;
- failure to meet the minimum mandatory mobility period abroad of 5 days or cancellation of the mobility period;
- failure to issue the Transcript of Records and the "Statement of Stay" by the host University, certifying the completion of the physical and virtual components of the BIP abroad and the awarding of at least 3 ECTS.

It is also noted that the start of physical mobility abroad is subject to the deadlines set by the Host University.

The mobility grant covered by this Call is:

- **COMPATIBLE** with other scholarships and/or contributions provided by other funding bodies and/or scholarship providers. The recipient of an Erasmus BIP grant is still required to verify with the other funding body the compatibility of the Erasmus contribution with any other contributions requested/received. The International Mobility Office does not have such information.
- **INCOMPATIBLE** with other EU funds granted for the same purpose, i.e., to support the period of international mobility (See Art. 2.1 – General requirements).

ART. 5 – APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

The application must be **submitted solely online** through the designated [Google Form](#). The deadline for submitting the application is **07/01/2025**.

By participating to this Call, the candidates declare to:

1. have reviewed all the articles outlined in the Call;
2. accept all the conditions set forth therein;
3. meet the requirements specified in Art. 2 of the Call.

ART. 6 – SELECTION CRITERIA AND SCORE

The selection of applications will be carried out by Selection Committee and will consider the academic career as of 31/12/2024.

The selection criteria adopted by the evaluation Commission are:



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- compliance with the requirements outlined in Art. 2 of this Call;
- for students enrolled in the first year of the master's degree: grade of the first-level degree;
- for students enrolled in subsequent years: the number of credits foreseen and acquired in relation to the academic year (60 ECTS per year of enrollment) and the weighted average grade.

ART. 7 – EVALUATION COMMITTEE, RANKINGS AND ERASMUS BIP ACCEPTANCE

Three rankings will be drawn up, one for each Department.

BIP-type mobilities will be distributed across the rankings in order of score, with at least 3 BIP mobilities assigned per Department. Any unassigned BIP or virtual mobilities may be redistributed to rankings with eligible students who were not selected as winners. The rankings will be drawn up by the evaluation Committee specifically appointed, based on the score obtained. The rankings will be published on the official University *Albo* and on the dedicated pages of the Degree programmes and Departments participating in the project starting from 13/01/2025.

Successful candidates have 5 calendar days to accept or refuse their mobility grant starting the day after the eligible candidate list has been published by sending an e-mail to the International Office of their Hub:

- for the Department of Life Sciences and Systems Biology and the Department of Drug Science and Technology, the Hub of Sciences of Nature, international.sciences@unito.it;
- for the Department of Molecular Biotechnology and Health Sciences, international.medtorino@unito.it

Winners who do not accept the mobility within the established deadlines will be automatically excluded from the ranking, considered as official renunciants for this Call. Positions not covered due to non-acceptance or withdrawal from the BIP mobility will be assigned through the scrolling of the ranking. In this case, the assignment of the mobility will be communicated to the eligible candidates selected as replacements solely through an email sent to their institutional email address.

ART. 8 - INSURANCE

Mobility students have the same civil liability and accident insurance coverage as University students, throughout their stay abroad and during the course. When applying, the applicant declares:

- they have checked the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation website (<http://www.viaggiaresicuri.it>) for information regarding safety and health at the student's mobility destination abroad;



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- they have checked the UniTo website - Insurance (<http://www.unito.it/universita-e-lavoro/tutela-e-assistenza/assicurazioni>) for information concerning UniTo insurance policies for third party liability and accident coverage during traineeships abroad;
- they are aware that UniTo policies (third party liability and accidents) guarantee coverage for the insured person(s) within policy limits and only during mobility activities within the time and logistic limits defined in their training project;
- they will not hold responsible UniTo, their Department and associated offices of any liability should they suffer damage occurring outside the time and logistics limits, and activities not directly linked to their mobility.

Consequently, winners of this Call are advised to consider taking out a suitable insurance policy to cover their time abroad (including outside mobility) and expenses for medical and hospital care.

The National Health Service usually provides basic health insurance coverage through the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) for mobility students going to EU Member States, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland. However, European Health Insurance Card coverage may not be sufficient, especially if the student has to come home or needs specific medical care. Private supplementary insurance is therefore recommended for those travelling to these countries. Non-EU winner(s) do not enjoy similar health cover outside Italy even if they have EHIC and so should also take out private health insurance.

Mobility students travelling to countries other than those mentioned are required to find out about the host country's health insurance requirements and take out adequate private insurance that meets official local requirements to cover specific medical care.

The Participant must also check local restrictions or provisions in relation to possible emergency situations. It should be noted that mobility might be suspended, changed, interrupted or cancelled for safety reasons should the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation advise against travel to the student's chosen destination. This also applies to the University of Turin having consulted parties involved. Students are advised to assess risks carefully concerning their mobility abroad when emergency situations are ongoing and understand the destination country's safety measures.

Please note that departures are always subject to the host organisation acceptance.

ART. 9 – REFERENCE NORMS

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PRIVACY STATEMENT PURSUANT TO ARTICLES 13 AND 14 OF THE GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION (EU REGULATION 679/2016 AND COUNCIL REGULATION OF 27 APRIL 2016)

The University of Turin would like to emphasise that Erasmus+ BIP mobility candidates' personal data acquired upon application or any specific method of collection will be processed in the course of its teaching and research activities. This is in compliance with general principles of lawfulness, correctness, transparency, limitation of scope and retention, data minimisation, accuracy, integrity, confidentiality and accountability according to the personal data protection code and University regulations implementing the code and sensitive and judicial data. See www.unito.it, "Statute and Regulations", "Regulations: procedures".

As part of the principle of transparency, the following information is available to make students aware of data processing characteristics and methods and pursuant to Art. 13 of EU Regulation 2016/679 (hereinafter referred to as GDPR):

(a) Data controller and contact details

The Data Controller is the University of Turin, in the person of its *pro-tempore* legal representative (*Magnifico Rettore*) with registered offices in Via Verdi 8 - 10124 Turin (contact details: pec address: ateneo@pec.unito.it - email address: rettore@unito.it; telephone 011 6706111).

(b) Data Protection Officer (DPO) contact details

The Data Protection Officer (DPO) can be contacted at this address: rpd@unito.it.

(c) Purpose of processing and legal basis

Processing a data subject's personal data is done in the public interest or as part of an authority's obligations under Article 6(1)(e) EU Regulation 2016/679 for the following purposes:

- 1) managing student's career path (from enrolment to graduation) including sending relative communication and storing and archiving all documents concerning the Erasmus experience;
- 2) managing traineeships;
- 3) statistical surveys and both aggregate and anonymous historical and scientific research;
- 4) consultancy and support to students in need;
- 5) managing support for students with disabilities or specific learning disabilities;
- 6) University communications for administrative, educational and research purposes (eg, reporting seminars, events and conferences);
- 7) providing facilities, grants and study awards and other services related to the right to university study.

Following on from 7) and in accordance with GDPR Article 14, the University applies discounts on student fees and so acquires student ISEE values, household member numbers and any information students provide in their DSU (right to university study) application. This is only if it is relevant for this purpose, and will be taken directly from the INPS database as per D.P.C.M. 5 December 2013, No.159.

This data will be published in the "Transparent Administration" section and University portal when the eligible candidate list is published and in accordance with Transparency D.Lgs 33 dated 2013 consolidated text.

For the above-mentioned processing purposes and in specific situations, special categories of personal data



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such as data relating to criminal convictions and offences or related security measures may be collected and processed pursuant to Article 10 of the GDP.

d) Types of data processed

The personal data collected and processed by the Controller for the above-mentioned purposes includes:

- personal data;
- contact details;
- ISEE/ISEE equivalent value/GDP per capita PPP data
- academic career data

The Controller collects and processes personal data of a particular category as per Article 9 EU Regulation No. 2016/679 for the above-mentioned purposes, ie:

- health-related data regarding support special needs mobility.

e) Providing data

Students must provide the required data as part of the assessment process for applying to the Erasmus+ for Traineeship mobility Call. Students who don't provide such data will not be admitted to the mobility selection and cannot complete the necessary procedure.

f) Processing methods

Processing personal data will be done both manually and digitally guaranteeing the security and confidentiality of such data. In order to achieve this, data is processed in the University of Turin by technicians who are authorised to process it under the Controller's responsibility, and who have been adequately informed and trained for this purpose.

g) External Data Processors

The data may also be communicated and processed externally by third party providers of certain services necessary for the performance of the processing, who act on behalf of the Data Controller for the sole purpose of the requested service and who are duly appointed "Data Processors" pursuant to Article 28 of EU Regulation 2016/679.

h) Categories of recipients of personal data

Personal data will be shared with the following categories, in accordance with current regulations:

- 1) Ministry of University and Research – MUR;
- 2) INDIRE, National Erasmus+ Agency;
- 3) European Commission International Mobility programmes;
- 4) National registry of students and graduates;
- 5) Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Embassies, Prefectures, Police forces for recognising special status;
- 6) Public Prosecutor's Office, Bar of the State for litigation and disciplinary proceedings;
- 7) Certifying centres, when checking replacement declarations made in accordance with D.P.R. n.445/200;
- 8) Other Italian and foreign universities, for transfers to and from such universities;
- 9) Higher education Partner institutions in student mobility programmes;
- 10) Public and private entities managing research grants and/or scholarships or promoting studies and research, university development projects;
- 11) Piedmont's Right to University Study Regional Body which manages right to study services (scholarships, residences, canteens);



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- 12) Intesa Sanpaolo – bank who acts as University cashier, collects university fees and contributions and pays scholarships;
- 13) Interuniversity Consortium for Automatic Calculation - CINECA, manages competition procedures ie awards and scholarships, manages and maintains student career path apps;
- 14) Other private external organisations supporting the management of competition tests and exams. See previous point;
- 15) Alma Laurea Interuniversity Consortium, for surveys on graduate profiles and employment status;
- 16) Insurance bodies for accident, civil liability policies;
- 17) Public or private external organisations for employment, cultural, recreational and sporting purposes;
- 18) Health facilities providing access to healthcare and hospitals.

Data processed for the purposes set out above will be shared with or accessible to teaching staff, employees or collaborators assigned to the University's relevant offices, who, as data protection contact persons and/or system administrators and/or authorised processors, will be adequately trained by the Data Controller for this purpose.

i) Transferring data to a third country

The University appoints third party suppliers known as External Managers for some of the above-mentioned institutional purposes, for example, Google for Education which is recognised as an appropriate guarantee measure whose services include transferring personal data to a non-European country via Google's "cloud" solutions. See the University website's Privacy Section on Google's Privacy and Security policies.

i) Data retention

Students' personal data concerning their University careers (eg, personal data, qualifications, intermediate and final test results, rankings, reports, etc.) will be kept for unlimited periods in order to comply with requests for certificates and checks, in compliance with current legislation archiving obligations.

The University will keep students' contact details (telephone, personal email) for the period necessary to achieve the purposes they were collected for and, after which, they will no longer use them.
